

OBIETTIVO

1. To promote and spread the message of *Laudato si'* and to initiate a sort of cultural revolution, creating ecological awareness among people.

2. To educate and encourage people to take some personal as well as common initiatives to care for Our Common Home.

DIDACTIC PROGRAM:

The Joint Diploma is a joint venture of the Pontifical Universities of Rome to create an interuniversity and interdisciplinary collaboration for a common cause – *Care for Our Common Home*. It consists of class room lectures, conferences and workshops. The lectures are based on six Modules (corresponding to the six chapters of *Laudato si'*), and each module is divided into three lessons (45 minutes each) followed by questions, clarifications and discussions. The lectures are held on the second Thursday of each month during the two Semesters of the Academic Year from **15.00** to **18.15**. In addition to the class room lectures, the students have to participate in the Annual Conference and the Workshops. For the completion of the Diploma, the students have to write a dissertation on the issues related to the themes of the six Modules, and appear before a commission of two Professors for the Final Exam (*Lectio Coram*) towards the end of the Diploma.

MODALITÀ

The Diploma is programmed for five consecutive Academic Years. Each Module of the class room lectures is divided into two subtitles to cover all possible fundamental ecological themes from different perspectives: theology, philosophy, socio-cultural, economic and political issues, eco-justice, sustainability, technocratic paradigm, reconciliation and ecological conversion, and ecological education. To facilitate the movements and the active participation of the students, the lessons are held in six centrally located Pontifical Universities of Rome: **First Module** (*Pontificia Università San Tommaso, Angelicum*), **Second Module** (*Pontificia Università della Santa Croce*), **Third Module** (*Pontificia Università Urbaniana*), **Fourth Module** (*Pontificio Ateneo Regina Apostolorum*), **Fifth Module** (*Pontificia Università Lateranense*) and **Sixth Module** (*Pontificia Università Antonianum*). The other Pontifical Universities have been chosen to organize the annual conferences.

WORKSHOPS ON “SIGNS OF HOPE”:

The Workshops helps the students to have a direct immersion into some of the concrete experiences of the ecological renewal. The students must

choose at least two experiences from the following “best practices”: (1) Eco-Justice; (2) Sustainable Economy; (3) Ecological Education; and (4) Ecological Spirituality and Contact with Nature.
